

International Economy

International economy focuses on international trade in goods, services, and capital. During the course will determine various economic forces that shape patterns of trade. We will investigate why economies trade, what products they trade, who trades them, at what price and quantities they trade, and study some of the benefits and costs of trade. In addition, a significant part of the course will also cover various policies that governments use to shape trade patterns among countries, and the reasons for implementing such policies. The issues discussed include gains from trade and their distribution; analysis of protectionism; strategic trade barriers; the trade deficit; exchange rate determination; and government intervention in foreign exchange markets.
